Adopt-A-Park Program

What is Adopt-A-Park?

Through the City of Midland's Parks and Recreation Department, local groups can adopt a City park for general clean-up. Major and block parks can be adopted. Adopt a park offers your group the opportunity to make a contribution to Midland and generate positive publicity for your service activities.



Who can adopt?

Any type of group! Civic organizations, schools, profit or non-profit organizations, businesses, service clubs, church groups, etc.

What does an Adopt-A-Park group do?

Parks are adopted for clean-up on a yearly basis. There are many parks to choose from, ranging from major parks to small block parks. Parks and Recreation staff will assist in selecting a park that matches your group's interests. Your group commits to four clean-ups in the park you adopt (or another time frame that is agreed upon by the organization and Parks and Recreation). Clean-up occurs once in the spring, twice in the summer and once in the fall. Clean-up includes bagging trash and yard waste for collection by City staff. Parks and Recreation will provide trash and yard waste bags. The four clean-up dates will be pre-arranged with Parks and Recreation staff.

Safety First!

Aside from bags, any equipment needed will be supplied by your group. Parks and Recreation staff will review applicable safety procedures and provide orange safety vests if needed. Each individual participating in the program will have to have a waiver on file with our department. These will be supplied to the organization representative.
